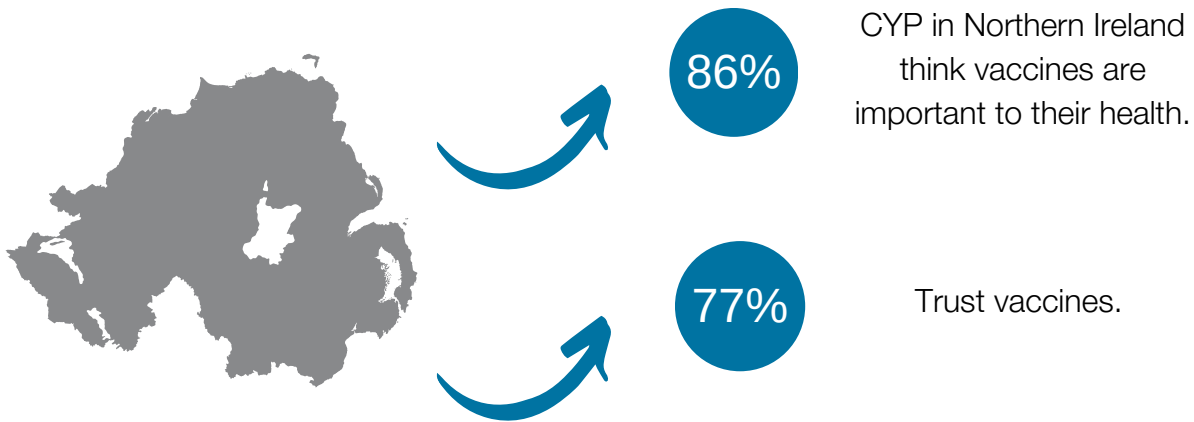
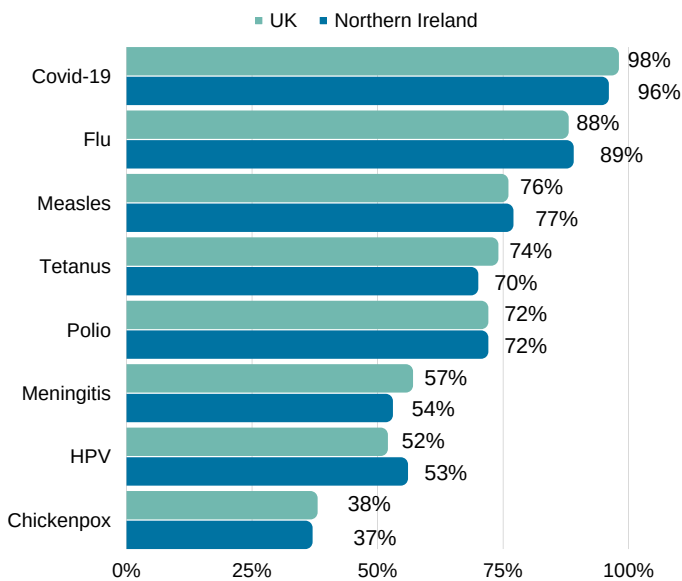


# Northern Ireland

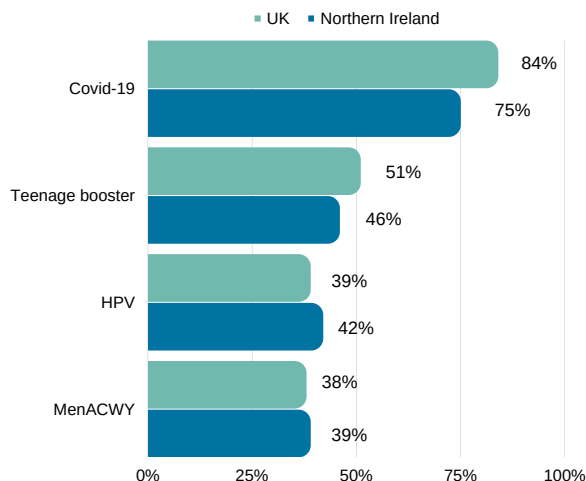


## % of CYP who think there is a vaccine for each one of the diseases below:

There were some differences in knowing which vaccines are available to them when comparing CYP in Northern Ireland to the UK.

 \*\*n= 57. RSPH/Dubit survey is representative of the country's population and was responded by 1,584 CYP in October 2022.

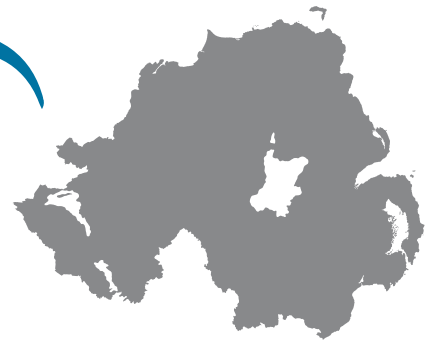
1  Parents - 89%

2  GP - 53%

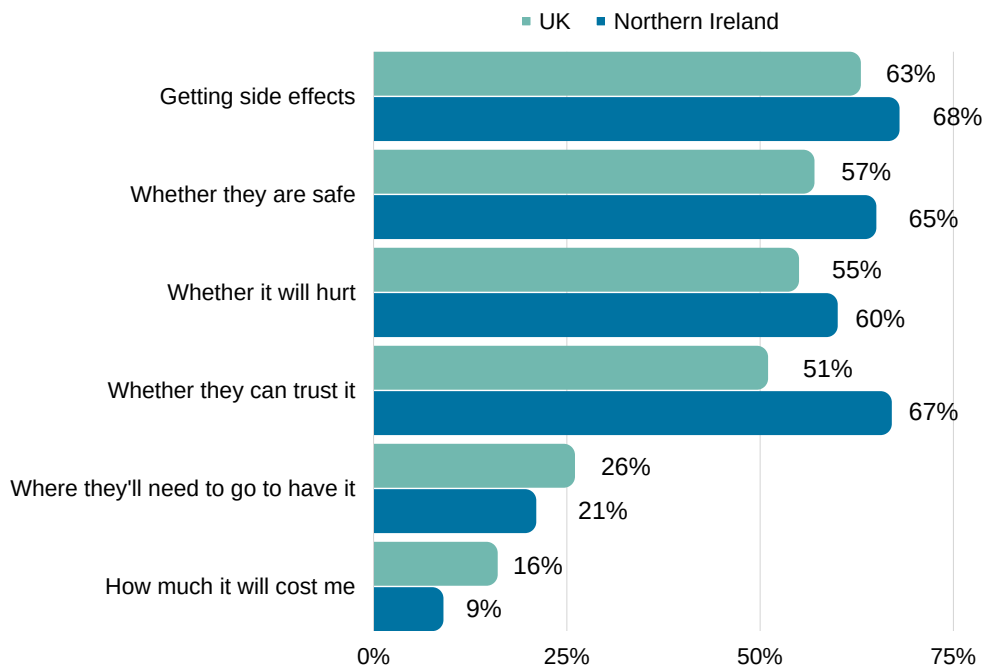
