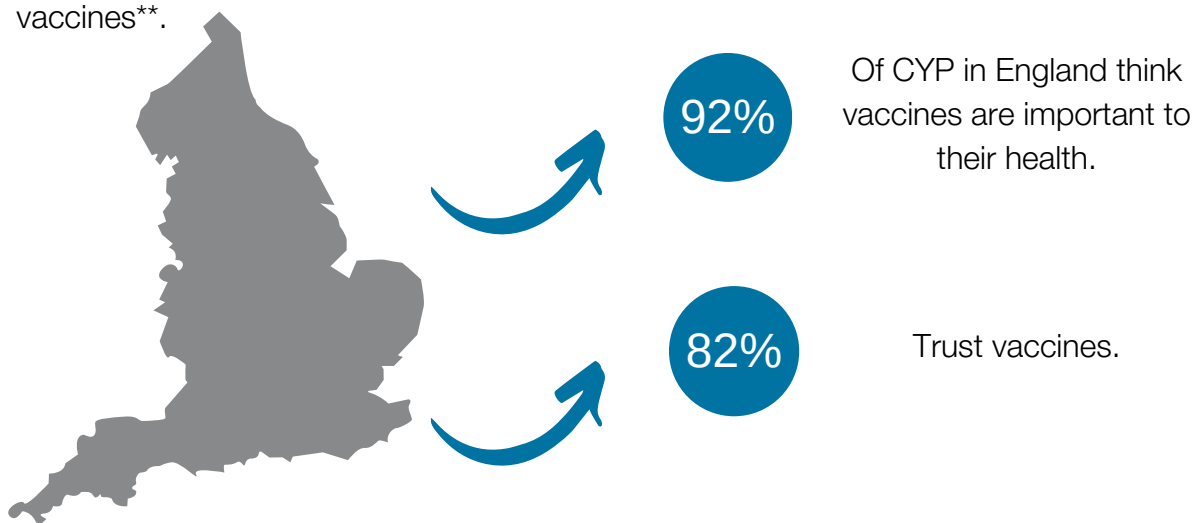
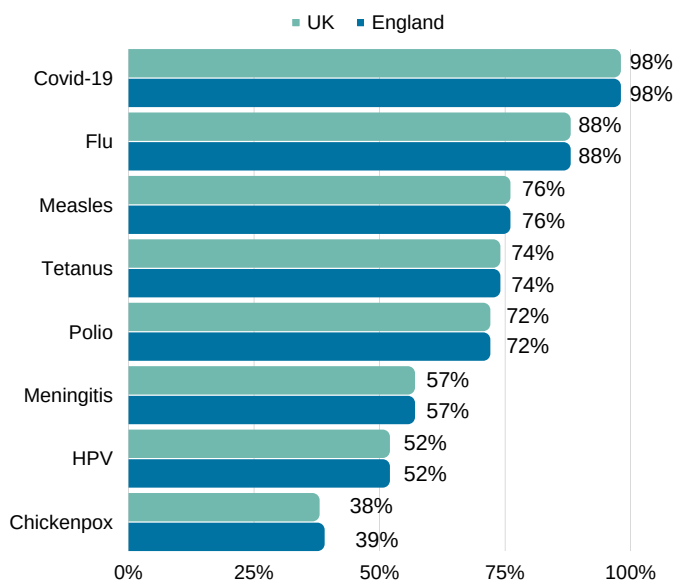


England

RSPH surveyed* 11-16 year-old Children and Young People (CYP) from across the UK. Below is a summary of what CYP in England told us about their attitudes towards vaccines**.



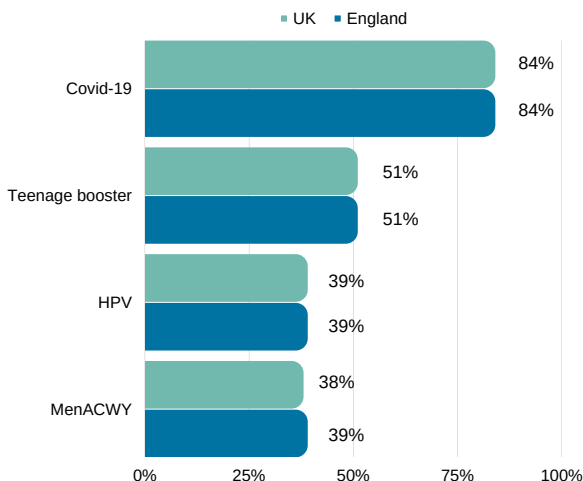
% of CYP who think there is a vaccine for each one of the diseases below:







With the exception of chickenpox, CYP in England do not differ from the rest of the UK in their knowledge of which diseases have a vaccine.

With the exception of MenACWY, CYP in England do not differ from the rest of the UK in their knowledge of which vaccines are available to them.

% of CYP who think the vaccine below is available to them:



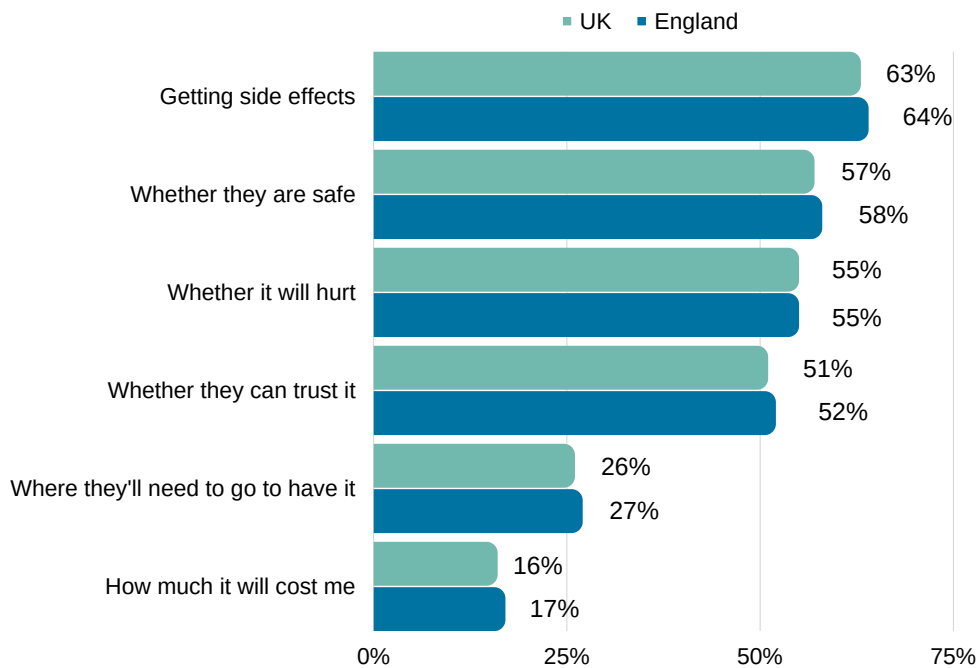
