
IMPACT PATHWAYS – Sexual and reproductive health and HIV



The actions taken will depend on the setting. In some settings tests, treatment and partner notification may be undertaken in situ. In other settings, signposting to other services will be sufficient. Antibiotic stewardship in sexual health is also a factor in treatment choice (especially in gonorrhoea) – see Public Health England's Antibiotic Awareness Campaign

Supportive resources: There is training available in sexual health and HIV. The Public Health England (PHE) framework 'All our health' has a section dedicated to sexual health and HIV, containing extensive literature on the different forms intervention can take.
